Mission To Kenya, Africa

PM Crusade at Makhanga (means guinea hen)

Tony:

Just a note that they have barking spiders in Kenya also!

We arrived in this very small village after another wonderful African lunch served by our gracious hosts. After a time of praise and worship, during which I continued to teach some of the believers how to receive, we asked for a testimony of someone that had been touched by the Lord during one of the meetings. An older lady came and said that for 65 years she had been deaf in one ear. (She was 85) She said the medical profession did all they could without any success. She said that she had been prayed for again and again for decades, with nothing happening. This time God did it and she felt like the man at the pool for 38 years, and then it just happened. She said that her ear is completely perfect. She went on to preach with authority, telling the people about Jesus. I knew that I only needed to say a few words after this lady was done. She had really raised the faith level of the people. I spoke for like 5 minutes, and then we gave words of knowledge.

The crowd was very small and the people were very scattered. As soon as the first miracle was announced and the shouting out of praises to Jesus began, then the people pressed in, not for prayer, but just to watch what was happening.

I prayed for three people to allow others to have fun. All three were Christians. First was a young man that struggled with constant back pain and his elbow on his left arm had something serious wrong with it that produced constant pain. He was instantly and I mean instantly healed. He was very happy. The second man had breathing problems, I think it was asthma. After a round of prayer he was breathing totally normal. Thank you Jesus. Thirdly was a lady that was helped up to us as her knees were badly

arthritic and very painful. As we began to pray she started vibrating like she was hooked up to high voltage. She started crying out the name of Jesus and running in place. Her activity drew quite a crowd. People came off the street to see what was happening. Her left knee was totally restored, but her right knee, after 3 rounds and 4 teammates praying found it only partially healed. Fredrick led her thru deliverance before the remainder of the healing came.

The crusade tonight was at a church, in fact there were two churches side by side. Worship was good and then I think we went right into words of knowledge and prayer. I prayed for several people with chest pain and a woman with a sore foot. God showed up and they left with their healing and a smile on their faces.

She received healing in one leg and began praising and jumping excitedly. She ended up having more prayer by the team and

Then I had 2 with heart conditions and irregular heartbeats. Both received healing, but one received salvation first. One of these also had poor eyesight since birth and said her sight had been restored. I was the last one on the prayer field and quite energized and yet I was so wiped out. Thanks Holy Spirit!

I spent the worship service holding the most beautiful baby. I rocked her to sleep and she was just so peaceful even with the wild music and hootin' and hollerin'. I was doing fine until she woke up and wanted to eat.... I'm not much help in that area. ☺

I also found out that diapers here are non-existent, and they pretty much just have an extra cloth wrapping which is definitely not moisture proof. ☹

After I gave little baby back for feeding and changing, it was time for prayer. The first two ladies I prayed for were rather angry, got healing and stomped off. I didn't really understand the problem, but my translator said it was something about them trying to disprove what was happening, but Jesus healed them anyways? The one I remember most was a beautiful young woman who looked to be about 16. She came to me with a big warm smile on her face and spoke very good English. She said that she was coming for her husband. He was home with burning pain in his side. I prayed the "Centurion prayer", you know, the one where the centurion comes to Jesus for prayer for his servant and the servant gets healed "long distance". I love that one. Afterwards, she stayed and talked a little. She had someone holding her baby for her, a beautiful little boy on 9 months and brought him over so that I could take a picture.

PS. Hopefully you remember the deaf/dumb boy we reported on in Naitiri village. (Wed. report) The one where we had the mother pray and one by one his ears opened and his first word was Jesus.

Well, tonight, his mother made the trek to this village to give testimony that not only could he hear well now, but that he has started talking more and more since then!!! Yipeeeee.
