Monday Last Conference Sessions & Outreaches

LAST CONFERENCE SESSIONS:

Tony,

It has become clearer why we are back in the Foya Area. This trip, there are many more churches and pastors that were not here the last time, and they are so hungry for the impartations. Also, this trip we are going out into the outer parts of the district to the villages to greatly expand the kingdom and to show those in training what they can continue to do. We were not able to do that on our previous trip.

Last Conference sessions today were deliverance training and impartation of Anointing. The leaders were all extremely into this training, I mean, really into it. It is so true that the people's hunger attracts the activity of heaven. You could hear the sound of Ahaaa...now I see, all around the room, with shouts of praise for what Holy Spirit is revealing to each one.

Of course, the impartation service is like the launching pad. I can see the entire Foya District being completely transformed now!

After we finished impartation and fire tunnel, the leaders came up to me and said "there is a mother here that has brought her young daughter. Her daughter has a broken her leg and cannot walk. They want you to pray!" They were surprised when I said "No, the team will NOT pray, those that we have just imparted to need to pray!" As we began to leave this huge huddle of fresh imparities gathered around the child. We later heard that the child received a miracle and was walking! Hallelujah!

We have a totally full day today, after impartation, preparing to head out for two outreaches.

Casey:

It is so hard to believe that this is our last official day on ministry in Liberia, where did the days go? We have been so blessed on this trip and so very well taken care of by Rev. Kettor and his team. They even thought of the small things like warming our water at night for our bucket showers. We have been upgraded to first class on this trip.

This being our last day they are making sure not a single hour is wasted. Today we have a very busy schedule. First thing we are finishing the conference with the deliverance training and then having a second session which will be the impartation service. Then we will break for a half hour to eat lunch and hit the road again. In the afternoon and evening we are going to have two village outreaches. Yep, it's going to be a long day boys!

The deliverance teaching went great this morning. There really is not a whole bunch to write about because they all prayed for each other after the teaching. Although they really loved the demonstrations that Tony and I showed them. It just makes it so simple to understand when you can actually see something being done while you are given instructions on how to do it. They got it for sure. Praise God.

The second part of the morning session is impartation time. That is always a hoot and it's got to be one of our most favorite things to do during any conference we teach. Just giving away all our anointing and blessing the people with everything we have. Gold and silver we have none, but what we do have...look out. FIRST OUTREACH: SADU Village:

At the first a smaller village where one of the pastors at the conference has a small church, he had notified the people of his village that he was coming and they were to gather all the sick. It was fun watching the sicknesses leave the people as the pastor prayed. The people of the village needed to see that!

From the town drunk that had pain everyday all over his body to the young lady with leprosy. All healed! I liked the "ex" town drunk. First thing he says when we asked if we could pray for him: "Can I have a drink first?" Oh yeah, have I got a "drink" for you! When the healing power of the Lord hit him, he wasn't thinking about drinking anymore. First thing in his heart now was he wanted to receive Jesus and he just wanted to let the others see what had happened!

An older lady came walking up and just started barking orders to all the people around. I didn't think much of it since I couldn't understand the language. Pastor asked if she wanted to be healed of her body pains and difficulty walking. Then he said to her will you follow Jesus if He heals you? Will you give your life to Him and receive Him as Lord & Savior, and Will you give up your practice? She said, "If this Jesus can heal me of my sicknesses and pains I will do it! All the people were watching intently. As the power of God came up her and her joints starting functioning she kept turn to the people, her eyes really big and say to them "Are you seeing this!!!" Then she would YELL, "I said, are you seeing this!"

Now Get This: Now I found out that this lady was the Demonic Traditional Chief of this Village and was always practicing the demonic and using witchcraft to control people and lead the village. When she received the Lord, everyone started screaming and yelling for joy. It was only later I found all out what was happening so I understood. There you go, convert the government of a municipality and it will filter down! Good days ahead for this village!

Whit had a particular attraction to the blind people on this trip. When we were on the plane headed from the US, Whit said, "Just one thing, Just one thing I am asking of the Lord. I want to see blind eyes open when I pray!" Well, that he did, again and again. As we were getting ready to get in the vehicle to leave this village someone said there is a blind girl here now. I didn't

even have time to turn to look and Whit had his hands on her eye praying. It was less than 30 seconds later and she had perfect sight restored! "Delight yourself in the Lord and He will give you the desires of your heart!"

Casey:

The first village outreach was right on the boarder of Sierra Leone as a matter of fact we were so close we walked across the border, just because we could. This was a village we were supposed to visit on Sunday but we never made it. It was cool driving through the jungle passing through several small villages along the way. Every village we passed through all the children would be shouting pu-wee pu-wee I'm guessing that means white man. They sure make you feel welcome in their village even if you are just passing by. The village we went to was small and right out of a national geographic magazine. We got to pray for a few of the villagers that wanted to be prayed for. One was this old man that said he had body pains and after praying for him Tony asked him to stomp his feet to see if the pain was gone. The old man started marching in place yelling right left right left right left and saluting us. Tony started laughing and saluted him back and shouted solder dismissed. Everyone was laughing this old guy was great. Another older woman wanted prayer for her feet and back, but before we prayed she received Jesus as her savior. That was worth the long drive to the border. Before we had to take off for the next outreach Whit brought a few bags of candy and was able to really bless all the children in that village. Way to go buddy.

SECOND OUTREACH: PAULUMA Village:

Tony:

ANOTHER VILLAGE SAVED!!!

Down the dirt trail we go again to the next village. The rest of the team had already gone ahead to this village to prepare. When we got there, praise had already begun. I got right into dancing with the children. We formed a huge dancing circle. We had to get out into the road (dirt path) and spread way out because it was so huge. Oh, how the kids loved it.

After Casey invited them all into an encounter with God that would give them eternal life, heal them and set them free we moved into demonstration mode.

The people pushed in again tonight, pressing to be touched by God. The Liberian teams were doing almost all the praying tonight and seeing one miracle after another. They seemed very quick to discern those that needed salvation and were leading them into the kingdom quickly.

A couple of testimonies to share: There seemed to be a run on epileptics tonight. One that got me good was a young girl, maybe 5 years old. Her mother brought her and said "my daughter has fits and has never been able to even stand – look at her, she shakes like this all the time!" The Liberian team said No Problem and just went right after it! They broke the curse,

commanded the epileptic spirit to leave, released healing and then took the hands of the little girl and held her up so that her feet were just touching the ground. Her legs still twisted and body shaking, they commanded life into those limbs. Then they let go of the child's hands. Oh, God, the look on the child's (and mothers) faces when she stood there, her legs strengthened, straightened and tremors gone! The next thing they did was to begin to lead the child to walk for the first time. And walk she did! When the mother demonstrated to the people her daughter's healed and walking condition the place erupted!

There was a man that came and said that his right eye was extremely sensitive to light. He couldn't go out in the day without covering it. At night, any light would bring him pain and watering of the eye. Now, these villages have no power. There are no electric lights at night normally in these villages, flashlights, candles and fires is it. I prayed once, no change. Second time I prayed I stood in the way of the bulb light that was shining into his face (one of 5 running off our generator). "I thought" let me make it easier by blocking the light! Took his hand off his eye and said to me "get out of the way of the light!" I moved and he hollered out "Praise God, I am healed!" I realized right there that my faith was in fail mode for this guy and I was trying to make his shock of not getting healed, not so bad! Amazing how, even in the midst of awesome miracles like what is happening here we can take a side step. Big thing is seeing it and getting back on track. And of course, Our Loving Heavenly Father covers our weakness to bless His Creation! All Glory to God!

AND the final curtain is lifted when the lost of this Village come running to Jesus! We came to another village tonight with few Christians and we leave with what looks like the entire village saved! How could it get better than this! Oh yeah, almost forgot, the village Elders and Chief committed their lives and this operation of this village to Jesus tonight!

Casey:

Here we go part two of our last day. The second outreach of the day was over an hour long drive back through the jungle and passing through all the same villages we drove through earlier. Again as we passed through all you could hear was the ringing of pu-wee pu-wee and all the small children hoping you will just wave at them. This place rocks, I really love it out here on the edge. When we pulled up to the outreach sight the worship team was already cranking and kicking up some dust. No sooner as we stepped out of our vehicle we were totally surrounded by all the small children. So what's one to do but start dancing with them. They just soak up all the attention you give them and if you pay too much attention to just one of them they start to fight over you. They just you to love on them so much it makes you want to put one in your pocket and take them home.

When the worship ended Tony had me share again tonight so I shared a short message and released some words of knowledge so we could get right into praying for healing. I teamed up with one of the local pastors tonight which I fully believe that's what the Holy Spirit wanted. The first three people I prayed for were instantly healed from their body pains, but then came a shift in the spirit. All the villagers wanted me to pray for them and not the local pastors. Now

when I prayed nothing was happening. So I told the pastors to pray and instantly the people were getting healed once again. It didn't take long for the people to see who they wanted to get prayer from and so I got left in the dust. I was so blessed just to sit back and watch the pastors get to use their new anointing. The pastor I was with prayed for this small girl that was blind, mute and her hands were all crippled up. He prayed over this little girl with the love of Jesus and one by one she began to receive her healing. The small girl got her sight, began to speak for the first time with a clear voice all while clapping her hands. The best part of her healing was being able to watch her mother watch her child get totally healed and restored. She was so happy she was crying tears of joy and laughing. It was a beautiful moment I won't forget anytime soon. He prayed for deaf ears and they opened instantly. It didn't matter who he prayed for they all got healed. They gave a salvation call tonight and just like at the other outreaches it looked as if the whole village came to receive Jesus. The village chief even proclaimed that his village was now going to live for Jesus only. Praise you Jesus this has got to be one of the greatest trips ever.
