

05-23-2015 Philippine Mission House and Street Evangelism Outreach

Tony,

We offered to any that attended the conference, to go out with us to a small village for house/street evangelism. It is so easy here as many of the houses are made out of tin or bamboo, many open even without windows. There were narrow dirt walkways between the houses and little open areas in the middle between clusters of houses where they washed and hung their clothes and little children played.

There were about 40 people that went out with us, a lot of them young folks. We had 9 teams, with an American leading each team. This is so much fun. Our purpose is two-fold, to bring the life of Christ to the people and to activate those being trained in the conference.

I mean, you just walk down these paths and can see right inside about 4 houses at the same time. You can see if there is anyone home, so we just tell them we are missionaries and have come to bring blessing and healing to their lives. The people stop what they are doing, say "please come in my house!" We walk in and ask if there is anyone sick in their family, if they say no, then we ask if we can release a blessing upon them. They are all quick to say, "Yes please!"

So, I showed them the simplicity of this the first time, as our Filipino team interpreted my words. After that, I had them do all the praying. It is amazing, once they step into it the first time and watch Holy Spirit flow thru them, the next time there is no need to ask them to do it – they are just On It!

Healings, Blessings and Salvations we flowing today. As our team arrived in the center common area for the entire village, we got there just in time to see the entire basketball team of about 20 youth receiving Jesus as Daisy was leading them in prayer. These young men with hands in the air praising Jesus for saving them! Smiles everywhere as the Glory of God

moved into this village. I thought, in one hour, with all these teams, everyone in this village can be saved, healed and delivered in just this one day! Glory, Glory, Glory to God!

Then the team was invited to one of the Pastors homes. It is actually a farm with a church on the road side of the farm. They gave us fresh coconuts and pineapple. Mrs Pastor got radically healed in the conference. She had for TWENTY YEARS suffered with some kind of disease that made it difficult to walk and she just kept jumping, smiling and laughing!

Today was a outreach day to a village that was just outside Davao city. When we arrived we broke into nine teams and took this village by storm. They were amazed when they removed their hands and this small boy stopped crying and all the pain was gone. Boom just like that. After that the small boy followed us from house to house watching every move we made. I said, "ok boys you're up" and again they placed their hands on the woman and commanded healing over her whole body. They had to pray twice for her but she received total healing. Then all of a sudden it was like a light went on in her head. She went into her room and brought her husband who was sick from TB. After prayer all the pain in his body was gone and he said he felt good which he hasn't felt in a long time. Praise God. The young boys were so excited to see the power of God flowing through them. I think they got it :-)

After three prayers his pain was almost gone. I stepped in and prayed once again and the rest of the pain left. Praise Jesus! We then blessed both of them.

Next we went to a house with a woman with pain in her stomach area. My team prayed and all pain left. We thanked the Lord and moved on. We went to another house and asked the people if we could bless them after they refused prayer. They said yes and we proceeded to pray a blessing and for Jesus to come and heal them. We stopped at the next house and a young woman said her mother and father were in the back building their house and did not want us to come and pray. So we spoke a blessing over the girl, her parents, and their home.

It was humbling to see how they lived without any of the things we take for granted. They did have electricity and televisions, but not much else. And yet they all seemed content especially the children enjoying playing basketball and hanging out together in the village square, if that is what it is called.

Next we were taken to a small church where we had fresh coconut milk and coconut. I say fresh because they had just been taken off the tree and cut open for us with machetes. Very tasty and very different. We had a brief prayer session in the little church and spoke over them what the Lord put on our hearts. We blessed them and then returned to our hotel to rest and pack. We will be leaving for the next venue in a few hours.
